Certificate I in Transition Education

Learn new skills and explore your work and life goals. If you have a permanent cognitive impairment or intellectual disability and need support with your learning, then our Certificate I in Transition Education could be the course for you.

About the course

This course supports people with special learning needs and helps them develop skills for further study or employment in a supported environment. Students develop social, life and communication skills, and increase their confidence and travel independence in the community. Skills include personal development, basic literacy and numeracy, everyday technology, independent living and vocational and employability skills.

Course structure

This course is made up of 10 units of competency including 6 core and 4 elective units.

Core units

- VU23034 Develop personal goals with support
- VU23035 Explore self-development
- VU23036 Participate in travel activities
- VU23037 Explore future options for further training, work, or community activities
- VU23038 Participate in the community
- VU23039 Use technology for a range of purposes

Electives

- VU23057 Participate in creative activities
- VU23040 Explore personal well-being
- VU23044 Apply communication for personal purposes
- VU23043 Participate in recreational activities

Elective units in our courses may be amended for specific organisational needs. Consultation with the Education and Training Manager is required for tailored electives that align with your organisations requirements.

Course duration

This model is delivered over a 50 week period.

Classroom model - Training is delivered 2 days a week (excluding public holidays and school holidays).

Practical placement

There is no practical placement included in this course.

Entry Requirements

This course is restricted to post compulsory school aged learners with evidence of a permanent cognitive and/or intellectual disability.

You will also need to provide evidence of COVID-19 vaccination.

Course fees

Government funded: \$100

*Enrolment Fee includes the administration and materials cost.

Self-funded: \$17,255

Individuals ineligible for funding are obligated to cover the self-funded fee, which incorporates the enrolment fee. Eligibility criteria applies.
